SUMMER REFLECTION OF YOUR LAY LEADER

It is not unusual for us to worship together with the folks from Norwalk United Methodist Church. We have done that occasionally through the years. What was unusual this summer was that it was not more of the same *Every Sunday* in July and August we worshipped and enjoyed fellowship after worship together. We really began to get to know each other!

It is not unusual for us to have occasional conversation about what United Methodist presence in Norwalk should look like. What was unusual this summer was that our District Superintendent asked some of the leadership to engage in conversation with each other in a more intentional manner. And she joined us! Where is God leading us? We are still working on that one. We do know that if we do it together, perhaps it can be that BIG mission that Ronell has challenged to find.

The Book of Discipline in ¶2527 indicates that trustees are "vested with authority and power in matters related to the real and personal property of the local church", and the trustees of both congregations take that seriously. This summer they have talked and prayed together about the responsible use of United Methodist assets in Norwalk. This has led them to recommend that the two congregations merge into one United Methodist Church in the city. A BIG first step in helping us discern our BIG mission!

It can't and it won't happen overnight. It calls for more and deeper prayer and conversation together in each congregation and together. It is exciting, it is scary because it means change, it is challenging us to rely as never before on God's leading us.

No, this summer was not $d\acute{e}j\grave{a}vu$. This summer we began to sense that we are called to dare to follow God's leading. We are called to pray (and sing) the words of Psalm 5:8: "Lead me, Lord, lead me in thy righteousness, make thy way plain before my face" and then follow wherever that leads us.


